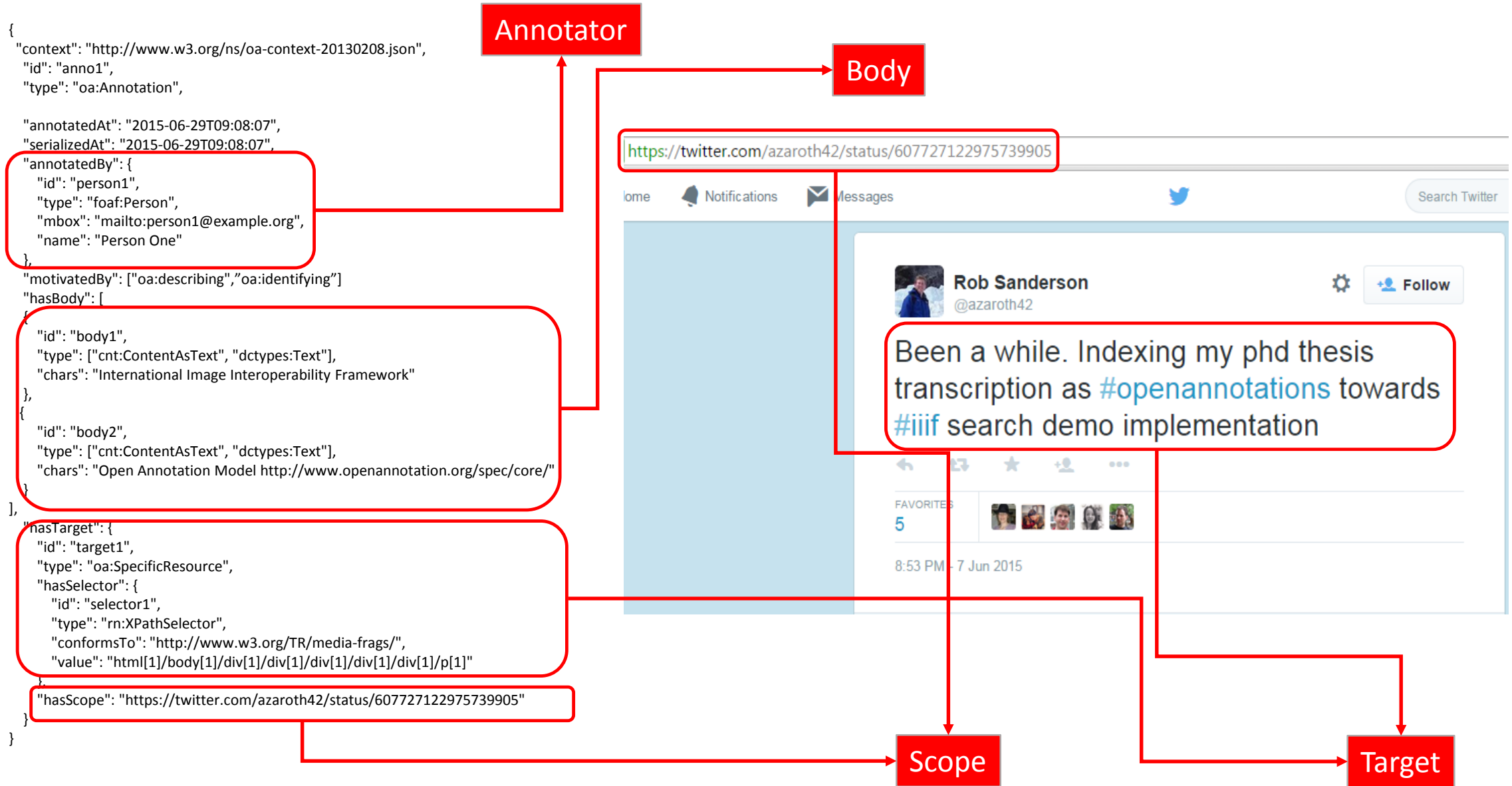

Conduct of Resit Exams

2012/2013 Academic Year Fall Term Conduct of Resit Exams

According to the University Senate's decision taken on 5.12.2012, resit exams for the 2012-2013 academic year Fall term will be conducted as follows:

**Courses for which resit exams will be given:**

1. Resit exam will be given for courses that have final exams.
2. Resit exams will not be given for withdrawn courses.
3. Resit exams will not be given for courses that have received the sign I.

**Who can take the resit exam?**

4. Students who have taken the final exams but failed to get a passing grade in the course will receive the sign E.
5. Students who receive the sign E can take the resit exam.
6. Undergraduate students who have taken the resit exams and have been successful will receive the grade DD in the course; graduate students who have taken the resit exam and have been successful will receive the grade CC in the course.
7. Students who have not taken the resit exams or have been unsuccessful at the resit exams will receive the grade F.
8. Students who did not take the final exams of a course cannot take the resit exams.
9. Students who had the right but did not take the resit exam of a course cannot take an excuse exam.
10. Students who fail the course after taking an excuse exam (for the final exams) cannot take a resit exam.
